



## **PHC Employment Trends (2022)**

Nurses practise in a variety of primary health care (PHC) employment settings in Ontario, including Community Health Centres (CHCs), Family Health Teams (FHTs), NP-led clinics, Physician's Offices, and Remote Nursing stations.


## Where are PHC nurses (NP, RN, RPN) employed?

- NPs were more likely to work in CHCs, FHTs, and NP-led clinics and less likely to work in physician's offices compared to RNs and RPNs.
- The greatest proportion of RNs work in a physician's office, followed by CHCs and FHTs.
- RNs are more likely than their NP and RPN counterparts to work in a remote nursing station.
- Almost half of the RPN workforce working in PHC work in physician's offices.

## **Trends in Nursing Employment Rates by Primary Care Setting (2020-2022)**



The proportion of NPs working in CHCs decreased 3.2% between 2015-2022 (13.5% to 10.3%). Further, the proportion of NPs working in FHTs decreased 3.4% (15.9% to 12.5%).
